

## **BHIVA BASHH Community Bursaries**

- Awarded to UK-based community workers to attend the conference.
- Up to 15 awards will be available to applicants who are affiliated with an HIV or sexual health treatment, research, vaccine information or educational organisation and who are actively involved in community treatment and prevention, education or training.
- You will be asked to upload a statement showing that you have a viable plan to share what was learned at the conference, particularly with other treatment and research educators. This will form the basis for selection for these bursaries.
- A maximum of one bursary per organisation will be granted.

The support will cover:

- Conference registration fee
- A contribution of a maximum of £325 towards economy travel or accommodation expenses, paid post event via an expense claim form and submission of receipts

How to apply:

- Applications to be made during the registration process. Please follow the registration link, select the registration category 'I wish to apply for a Scholarship'. Then select 'BHIVA BASHH Community Bursary' on the subsequent page.
- You will then be asked to provide a written statement to show how you intend to share your learning from the conference. Applications that don't contain a written statement, will not be considered.

Applications must be received by midnight on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> February 2026.

- If you are not successful, your registration will be changed to a 'community registration' place and you will be required to pay the earlybird community registration fee or cancel your registration.

Successful community registrants will be required to pay the full applicable registration fee post conference if they fail to attend the conference or provide 14 days' notice of their cancellation.
